Fairground Rules

Parking:

Parking is available at both the north and south entrances to the Fairgrounds. We ask the cooperation of the public to enter the north Fairground parking area from U S Hwy 301 and enter from Market Road for the south parking area.

Passes:

All exhibitors (other than livestock), vendors and participants must have a pass for entrance to the Fairgrounds. Enter only through the pass gate (located at the main entrance).

Public Restrooms:

Restroom facilities are located in the Main Building (Building #1) and the Arena.

Handicap/Disability Facilities:

Parking and restroom facilities are provided for Fair Patrons with disabilities.

First Aid/Lost and Found:

Please go to the Fair Information Booth located in the Main Building (Building #1).

Important Rules and Regulations:

- 1. Alcoholic beverages are prohibited on the Fairgrounds by County Ordinance.
- 2. All Exhibit/Show Livestock on the Fairgrounds must follow the State of Florida Health Requirements.
- 3. No pets (dogs, cats, exotic animals, etc.) will be permitted on the Fairgrounds with the exception of certified service animals.
- 4. Persons causing a disturbance, trespassing upon the grounds, climbing over fences or otherwise fraudulently gaining admission, will be arrested and prosecuted.
- 5. We encourage the humane treatment of animals. Abuse will not be tolerated. The comfort and safety of the animal must be addressed throughout the Fair. Non-stressed animals will perform better for the handler. Exhibitors are expected to handle their animals in a gentle and calm manner and not create undue excitement including in the vicinity of other livestock or persons.

BOOTH EXHIBITOR RULES & REGULATIONS

- Exhibitors may set up Friday, Saturday, and Monday, 3/3, 3/4 and 3/6/23, from 10 AM—5 PM and Tuesday, March 7 from 9 AM—Noon. All booths must be in place by Tuesday, March 7 at 12:00 noon.
- All booths not occupied by Tuesday, March 7, 5:00 PM will revert to the fair and all payments will be forfeited. The judging for all fair booths will take place at 2:00 PM on opening day.
 All exhibits and goods must be unpacked. Empty cases must be removed by exhibitors and concessionaires (who shall pay all expenses of conveying, delivering, arranging and removing their exhibits as well as the cost of erection of booths, fixtures, counters and all apparatus in connection with their exhibit).
- Electric lighting and wiring of every description shall be installed at the expense of the
 exhibitor under the supervision of the Fair Management. All exhibitors and concessionaires
 must furnish their own electrical fixtures.
- For security reasons, exhibitors may enter the building <u>only one hour prior to opening</u> each day of the fair. Deliveries by truck must be made 1 hour prior to opening time each day of the event. All exhibits must remain intact and open during fair hours until 10:00 PM Saturday night. Exhibited articles may not be removed until Sunday, March 12 from 2:00—4:00 PM. Removal of exhibits prior to this will be reason for forfeiture of any premium monies awarded.
- Aisles must be kept clear. No signs, banners, advertisements, trash, decorations or parts of exhibits will be permitted in the aisles. No soliciting in the aisles.
- Background draperies and/or side curtains will be provided by the Fair Association for all exhibition spaces.
- Bottled gas containers (butane, propane, etc.) are not permitted inside any Fair building. All
 decorations must be fireproof and subject to the approval of the Fair Management.
- Machinery in motion must be enclosed with a railing at a uniform height from the ground or floor of two feet, six inches (2'6"), side railing to be placed upon or within boundary of space occupied by the exhibitor.
- Exhibitors can sell and may advertise and distribute literature and advertising materials
 from their booth <u>only</u>. No speaking devices will be allowed in the building. Each exhibitor
 selling products is responsible for collecting sales tax and reporting it to the Department
 of Revenue themselves. This contract does not give exclusive rights to sell or display any
 product unless so specified on the Contract for Space.

EXHIBITORS INFO

BOOTH AWARDS

Awards will be presented to the best overall booths following judging on Tuesday, March 7. There will NOT be educational and commercial categories; only the top three highest scoring booths will be awarded. The following system will be used as a basis for judging:

Draws Attention	25 points
Originality	25 points
Educational Aspects and/or Advertising Value	25 points
Use of Theme	25 points
TOTAL POSSIBLE POINTS	100 points

1st Place: Plaque and \$100 2nd Place: Plaque and \$50 3rd Place: Plaque and \$25

AGRICULTURE PRODUCTS & HORTICULTURE DIVISION

Superintendents: Lizzie Whitehead, Agriculture / Luke Harlow, Horticulture

Eligibility:

Open to amateur and professional gardeners who are residents of or work in Bradford and Union Counties.

Divisions:

Divisions compete independently of each other.

Youth Division:

Participants should be 18 years old or younger as of September 1, 2022.

- A. Youth Division (Y)
- B. Youth Exceptional (YE)

Adult Division:

Participants should be 19 years or older as of September 1, 2022.

- A. Amateur (AA)
- B. Professional (AP) Nursery operators, landscapers horticulture instructors and consultants.
- C. Adult Exceptional (AE)

Plant Delivery & Registration:

All plants should be brought to the entry receiving area located in Building #2 at the fairgrounds on Monday, March 6, 2023 between 8:30 am and 6:00 PM with form (available at the Bradford County Extension Office). Master Gardener volunteers will be on hand to assist you in filling out a registration form, and they will attach an exhibit tag to each plant. After your plants have been accepted and tagged it is requested that you leave the area in order to avoid congestion. There are no entry fees.

Plant Removal:

The receipt stub (bottom half of your registration form) MUST be presented at the time of exhibit removal. Exhibits will not be released without this stub unless approved by the Horticulture Exhibition Superintendent. Exhibits may be removed on Sunday, March 12, 2023 from 2—4 pm and on Monday, March 13, from 10 am until noon. Workers will be on hand to aid in pick up and to give out premium monies. Plants may not be removed at any other time unless prior arrangements have been made. Any unclaimed plants and prize money will be donated to the Bradford County Master Gardener program.

Forms:

All exhibitors must submit their contact information when plants are entered.

2023 Bradford County Fair Plant Show Rules

Care:

Plant care and watering will be provided by Bradford County Master Gardeners and volunteer helpers. All reasonable efforts will be made to provide adequate care and protection for exhibits during the fair. The Fair Association and the Bradford Country Extension Service are not responsible for damage to exhibits due to weather conditions or improper care or handling.

Entry:

One plant is considered one entry. Each entry will compete in one section (see Section description below) and must be of exhibition quality (see Plant Standards below). Exhibitors may not enter more than one plant of the same variety and color. Plants will be brought in on Monday, March 6th from 8:30 am to 6 pm with **form**.

Plant Standards:

Plants listed on the State of Florida Conservation list as rare or endangered will not be accepted unless acquired in a documented legal manner which must be provided. No plants will be accepted that are listed as an invasive species on the Florida Invasive Plant Council (https://floridainvasivespecies.org/plantlist.cfm). Any plant with pests will be disqualified, even if it was accepted at registration. All plants must be clean, groomed and in appropriate clean containers/pots. The use of plant shine or other oils will disqualify the entry. Plant must have good form and symmetry according to variety, health, and condition of the foliage, flowers, and fruit.

Judging:

The decisions of the judges are final. Judging will take place on Tuesday. March 7th. from 12 pm to 2 pm.

Criteria:

Adult division entries must have been grown by the exhibitor for **at least 6 months**, Youth division exhibits for **at least 3 months** by the exhibitor. The only exception to this rule is vegetables grown in pots and/or cut.

Attractiveness of Display:

Pot condition is very important. Black plastic pots will be accepted, but they must be clean and in good repair with no cracks, holes, etc. Decoration of the pot should be kept to a minimum. Double potting is allowed. (Example: placing a less attractive pot, like black plastic, into a more decorative pot.) Plant should not be freshly repotted.

Plant Size:

According to variety, pot size should be in scale to plant size.

Condition:

Plant cleaned and groomed. Pot clean. Debris removed. Free of diseases and insects.

Awards:

After being judged, the entries will receive either a 1st, 2nd or 3rd.

All containers 14" or over that are not hanging

2023 Bradford County Fair Egg Rules

Number of eggs

Exhibitors must have a full dozen eggs (12 eggs) in a carton.

Inspect Eggs

All the eggs need to be from the same breed of chicken. Eggs must be as identical to each other in color as possible. Once you have set aside your contenders for the egg competition, it is time to inspect them again, but this time for any blemishes that might diminish their perfection. Calcium deposits are a no go; put any eggs with buildup on their shells back in the "sell" pile. No cracked or broken shells will be accepted.



Judging

Judging will be based on uniform of size, shape, and color. Judging will also be based on how clean your eggs are! Please make sure you bring your eggs in a carton. Eggs must originate from exhibitor's personal flock.

2023 BRADFORD COUNTY FAIR HORTICULTURE AND AGRICULTURE EXHIBITION REGISTRATION FORMS ARE AVAILABLE AT THE BRADFORD COUNTY EXTENSION OFFICE

Registration forms may be filled out and brought in with the delivery of plants on Monday, March 6th from 8:30 to 6 pm

Plants may be claimed on Sunday, March 12th from 2 pm to 4 pm, or Monday, March 13th from 10 am to Noon, unless other arrangements have been made.

Entries not claimed at designated times will forfeit their prize money and plants to the Bradford County Master Gardener Program.



HOME DIVISION

Superintendent: Debbie Broome

Rules & Regulations:

- 1. Entries in the home division are open to all nonprofessional. men, women, youth (ages 6-18.)
- 2. Only articles listed in this premium book will be accepted for competition, with awards of either cash or ribbons given.
- All articles displayed must be the work of the individual exhibitor. Articles bought or borrowed will not qualify.
- 4. No articles will be accepted for judging that have previously been exhibited at the Bradford County Fair.
- All entries must be clean and in good condition and must have been completed with the past twelve (12) months.
- 6. No two (2) entries in the same lot will be accepted from one individual.
- Entries must be brought to the fairgrounds for registration during scheduled hours.
- 8. Entries will be accepted Monday, March 6, 9 AM-6 PM ONLY. <u>All entries enter through</u> <u>building 1 only</u>.
- Exhibit articles can be picked up on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>March 12, 2-4 PM</u>. Removal of exhibits prior to this time will be reason for forfeiture of any premium monies awarded. Exhibitors must be personally responsible for their articles.
- 10. The Bradford Agricultural Fair will assume NO responsibility for the damage or loss of articles exhibited. Reasonable care will be exercised to safeguard the articles left for display, but the Bradford Agricultural Fair will in no way be liable.
- 11. Judging will take place in Building 2 Tuesday, March 7, 9 AM-12 Noon.
- 12. The public should refrain from being in the building while judging is in progress.

- A blue ribbon, red ribbon or white ribbon will be awarded in each lot at th discretion of the judges. There will be "Best Over-All" rosette awarded.
- 14. All jars must be clear, white glass (standard) canning jars either half pint, pint or quart. Jars must be clean. Rings removed, lids free of rust. All products should have been sealed by water bath or pressure canner. Paraffin is not accepted. No freezer products.
- 15. No commercial mixes or products to be entered.
- 16. All baked products must be on a heavy piece of cardboard covered with aluminum foil, not to exceed 2" beyond the product and must be labeled with the recipe attached to the bottom. No glass please.
- 17. Recipes for all baked and candy products are required on 3x5 cards.
- 18. New categories may be created at the discretion of the judges or superintendent.

All Exhibit / Show Livestock at the Fairgrounds must follow the State of Florida Health Requirements. Chapter 5C-4 of the Rules of the State of Florida, "Admission of Animals for Exhibition" is adopted as official requirements for admission of Animals for exhibition at the Bradford Agricultural Fair. Tampering with any animal entered, such as filling with foreign substances, etc., is prohibited.

- Exhibitors MUST wear closed-toed shoes. NO sandals or flip-flops.
- Each exhibitor must assume all liability in case of injury or damage by his/her animal(s).
 The Fair Association will not be liable for death of any animal or injury or damage caused by any animal.
- No excessive amount of build-up of shavings allowed in stalls.
- Stalls will be dressed for the Fair. ADDITIONAL SHAVINGS MUST BE PROVIDED BY INDIVIDUAL EXHIBITOR. Do not remove new shavings from the BAF shavings pile without the BAF Barn Superintendent's express permission.
- Wheelbarrows should be kept emptied and cleaned at all times.
- Use it Clean it.
- Wash-racks must be kept clean after EACH exhibitor use including removal of all your cleaning supplies, brushes, etc. Drains must be cleared after each use of the wash rack.
- No running or horse play on bleachers or barn/arena areas.
- As a courtesy, due to limited space, no saving bleachers with blankets, seat cushions, stadium chairs, etc. before shows.
- NO modification of pens or electrical components of BAF property under any condition.
- NO profanity on BAF property. The cooperation of adults and students is requested.

The Bradford Agricultural Fair (BAF) reserves to its Board of Directors, the final and absolute right to interpret all rules and regulations for the protection of its property and guests. The BAF reserves all rights to make changes to the rules and as the BAF Board of Directors deems necessary for the betterment, improvement and safety of exhibitors, volunteers and guests.

Location: Bradford County Livestock Arena (Admission for all over the age of 4 who are not exhibiting is \$3.00) Goats will arrive on Saturday, March 4, 2023 from 8:00—9:00 AM. The show will be on Saturday, March 4, 2023 at 10:00 AM in the Livestock Arena. Goats will be released after the ENTIRE show has been completed and the pens are cleaned out from hay and waste.

Health Rules:

All goats consigned for public exhibition in Florida must be covered by an Official Health Certificate issued by an accredited veterinarian certifying the animal to be free from symptoms of contagious or infectious diseases. This health certificate is to be obtained within 90 days of the Youth Goat Show and will be inspected upon arrival.

Per State of Florida regulations, all animals must be participating in the scrapies eradication program and have a scrapies tag **or** be registered by a breed association and have a legible tattoo and a certificate of registration.

- Order your scrapie tag at 866-873-2824. Tags are free and comes with an ear tag applicator. Be sure to order in advance and allow at least 2 weeks to arrive.
- If you purchase from a breeder, the breeder should tag goat (per Florida law) and you will not need to order scrapie tags.

Eliaibility:

The Youth Goat Show is open to all 4-H and FFA youth in both Bradford and Union Counties. Ages for each division are as follows:

Little Bits	5 - 7 year olds
Junior Division	8-10 year olds
Intermediates	11 - 13 year olds
Seniors	14 vears and up

(Must be of age by September 1, 2022) *Divisions may be combined at show time due to participation.

Entries:

No Buck entries will be accepted. Only doe and wether entries will be allowed. An exhibitor may have up to 3 entries but only one entry per class. Classes will be determined by division and age of goat. Entries will be accepted by **pre-registration only**. Pre-entry deadline is **October 3, 2022** at the scheduled meeting. All information on the entry form must be accurate and up to date by the December meeting. Changing animal information after December will not be allowed. All 4-H guidelines for minimum standards must be met. FFA members must meet minimum standards with FFA.

Record Books:

Junior, Intermediate and Senior exhibitors are required to **complete** a 4-H or FFA goat project record book. Failure to complete the entire record book will result in the exhibitor not being able to show. A Clover Bud Record Book is available for the "Little Bits" age group (5-7) at the Bradford or Union County Extension Office. Clover Buds are not required to complete a record book but are highly recommended. Goat project

record books are to be turned into the Bradford or Union County Extension Offices by their deadlines. Goat project record books are to be turned in to the Bradford County Extension Office by February 18, 2023 or the Union County Extension Office by their deadline.

Mandatory Meetings:

Exhibitors <u>must attend two meetings</u> in order to show. If an exhibitor is unable to attend three out of the five classes due to school related event a letter and a schedule with the event must be turned in by the meeting date by a parent/guardian. Meetings will be held at the Bradford County Extension Office. Locations may change depending on the number of entries:

General Rules and Information for Exhibitors:

- 1. The Bradford County Fair Association or the Bradford/Union County Extension Office will assume no liability for the loss or injury to any goat participating in this show.
- 2. Dairy goats must be dehorned. It is recommended that all other goats have their horns blunted. (Meaning no sharp edges.)
- 3. Dairy goats must be shown with a chain collar and all other goats must be shown with a matching loop leash and collar or chain collar. Clover Buds may use a rope halter.
- 4. Exhibitors must provide their own feed, feed containers, and water containers. Exhibitors are responsible for keeping their area clean and neat, and are responsible for watering and feeding their own animal(s).
- 5. Hay is not permitted in the pens in the Livestock Pavilion where the goats will be housed.
- 6. Junior, Intermediate & Senior exhibitors are required to wear 4-H or FFA attire. All exhibitors **must wear** jeans and closed-toe shoes.
- 7. State of Florida requires all goats must be either ear tagged or ear tattooed for a health certificate.
- 8. All goat exhibitors and vehicles transporting goats must enter the fairgrounds using the Livestock Gate off of Highway 301.
- 9. NO Goats in pens until inspected by State Inspectors. Violators will be disqualified.
- 10. It is highly recommended that each exhibitor seek out at least one sponsor of \$25 or more.

Entry Fee: \$25 per exhibitor, per entry.

 pullorum-typhoid clean hatchery. If this certificate is not presented, an official negative pullorum-typhoid
 test will be given by an inspector, courtesy of the Florida Dept. of Agriculture, at the time of entry.
- 2. Poultry judging will begin at 10 AM, Monday, March 6, 2023.
- 3. Poultry Trophies will be awarded as follows:

Poultry: Grand Champion Poultry Reserve Champion

- 4. Exhibitors are not required to be present for judging.
- 5. All poultry exhibits must stay in place until 10 PM on Saturday, March 11th.
- 6. No poultry maybe taken through any of the exhibit buildings under any condition. They must exit between Building #1 and the Arena.
- 7. No Rabbits or Poultry will be put into cages until inspected by State Inspectors.

Rabbits:

- 1. Rabbits will be judged Saturday, March 4, 2023 at 6 PM in the arena area.
- 2. Rabbits must be 3 months or older.
- 3. No doe with litter will be accepted.
- 4. One exhibitor can enter only up to three rabbits of same breed.
- 5. One rabbit per exhibitor in cross-breed class. (Cross-breed; any rabbit whose parents are from two different breeds.)

6. Trophies will be awarded as follows (Judging 6:00 PM March 4):

Rabbits: Grand Champion Rabbit Reserve Champion

- 7. Exhibitors must be in area during their class judging.
- 8. All exhibits must remain in place until 10:00 PM on Saturday, March 11, 2023.
- 9. No Rabbit may be taken through any of the exhibit buildings under any condition.

Record Books will be Judged via the Bradford County Extension Office for both Rabbits and Poultry.

POULTRY SHOWMANSHIP

Rules:

- 1. Showmanship will be held **Saturday, March 4, 2023 at 12:00 PM** in the Poultry Barn. Poultry must be tested and inspected by Dept. of Agriculture State Inspector during check in time of 9-11 AM on March 4, 2023.
- 2. Sick poultry or poultry showing signs of external parasites are not permitted.
- 3. Showmanship is open to Bradford and Union County youth exhibitors, 4-H or FFA members in good standing with their organizations.
- 4. Exhibitors must wear their showring attire as designated by their organization—FFA official dress or 4-H dress. Closed toe shoes are required. If not in an organization, collared shirt and jeans are recommended.
- 5. Exhibitors must sign up at the check-in table the day of the event. Sign up is from 9-11 AM.
- 6. The exhibitor assumes liability in case of death or injury of the poultry. No official may be held liable for the loss of any poultry.
- 7. Poultry not being entered into the fair show and which are brought only for showmanship must be removed from the fairgrounds following the event.
- 8. Awards will be given following the events.
- 9. Judges decisions are final.
- 10. Contact Bradford 4-H office or vanheusen.kaitlin@mybradford.us for more information or with any questions you may have.

Exhibitors are required to attend <u>2 mandatory meetings</u>. We advise that exhibitors try to attend all meetings due to important information that will be discussed. Board meetings are not mandatory for exhibitors. Exhibitors and parents are welcome to attend.

EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY/MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

Exhibitors shall be qualified 4-H or FFA BUCSS members in good standing at the time of 2nd weigh in. Exhibitors must be living in Bradford or Union County or attending a school in Bradford or Union County. A parent or guardian of each exhibitor shall be a member of the Bradford-Union Cattle Show and Sale. Annual dues of \$45 (per family) are due and payable no later than Saturday, October 1, 2022. Each animal entered shall be owned by the exhibitor and a \$25 entry fee (for first animal and \$10 for each additional animal) paid at the annual meeting/sign up, Saturday, October 1, 2022 at the Bradford County Fairgrounds. All exhibitors must meet all requirements of the BUCSS.

BEEF TICKETS

The BUCSS will sponsor a raffle to help cover Show and Sale expenses. A drawing will be held at the Steer and Heifer Sale for one front quarter and one hind quarter of beef. Winners do not need to be present for the drawing. Each exhibitor will be issued ten (10) \$5.00 tickets for every steer/heifer entered to show. Payment for tickets can be made at any BUCSS meeting. Ticket stubs must be turned in with payment by the February meeting. A \$100 award will be given to the exhibitor that sells the most tickets above his/her minimum required to show.

WORKDAY

Exhibitor must work a total of six (6) hours on a workday or pay \$100 to the BUCSS in place of the workday. Workdays will be scheduled and posted on Facebook page prior to workdays.

SUBSTITUTION

NO substitution of animals after the animal has been weighed and tagged in on October 1, 2022.

LIABILITY

The exhibitor assumes liability in case of death or injury of an animal until sold. No official may be held liable for the loss of any animal.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS (NEW)

In order to comply with the health requirements of the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, Division of Animal Industries, all animals must be accompanied by a valid health certificate from an accredited veterinarian. (health papers are valid for 90 days and must be valid thru the last day of fair). All animals must have Florida Department of Agriculture required premise ID tag INCLUDING STEERS! https://www.fdacs.gov/Agriculture-Industry/Livestock/Cattle-Bovine/Florida-Cattle-Identification/Florida-Livestock-Identification-Premises-Registration-FAO

RECORD BOOKS

Each exhibitor shall maintain a record book for the steer/breed project. The book must be turned into the exhibitors 4-H/FFA Advisor by the date that set by the 4-H/FFA Advisors. The 4-H/FFA Advisor must check in all the record books to the Bradford/Union County Extension Office.

BARN TIE/STALL ASSIGNMENTS

Tie space will be first come first serve at the 2nd weigh in. Animals must remain on trailer until processed by the Department of Agriculture and the BUCSS.

ANIMAL BEHAVIOR

All animals shall be properly trained to be manageable by the exhibitor while in the barn or show ring. Any animal deemed to be unsafe for exhibition may be disqualified at any time by the discretion of the BUCSS Board Members and shall be removed from the barn.

ANIMAL CARE

Animals must be fed and watered daily thru Saturday. If animals are not fed and watered daily, the exhibitor will be disqualified from showing and be removed from the barn and may be disqualified for the following years show.

ANIMAL TYPE

Only beef breeds may be entered. No bulls allowed. Horned animals shall be dehorned 30 days before the show. However, scurs and secondary growth of horns four (4) inches or less will be accepted.

CONTINUES NEXT PAGE

BARN CAPACITY

Exhibitors may enter one steer and up to two heifers in the Show or three heifers if not showing a steer.

SHOW EQUIPMENT

Stall dividers, water buckets and feed pans may be brought into the barn after your animal has been processed Monday, March 6, 2023. Any other show equipment may be set up in designated areas after exhibitors meeting.

GROOMING AND FITTING

All clipping, grooming, and fitting of animals during fair week shall be done by the exhibitor, a Bradford-Union 4-H Leader, an FFA Advisor or a member of the Bradford-Union Cattle Show and Sale.

FOREIGN SUBSTANCES

Tampering with any animal entered, such as filling with foreign substances, etc. is prohibited. The use of tranquilizers or any substances that alters the animal's behavior after arrival at show will be construed as a form of tampering. No weight enhancement of any kind will be allowed.

HOME GROWN

Animals eligible for homegrown contest must be born & raised in Bradford or Union County. This excludes calves resulting from Embryo Transfer from a dam that is not owned by a breeder from inside the county and calves resulting from a dam that was purchased after the time of conception.

HERDSMAN

Herdsman is the responsibility of each exhibitor

- Animals should always be clean with proper grooming, bedding and care apparent.
- Animals are to be properly tied, fed and watered per rules of the barn.
- Stalls are clean and neat. Bedding is clean and fresh. Feed pans and buckets clean.
- Exhibitor Educational Poster will be hung up at the Extension Office
- Exhibitor's share of the alley way should always be kept clean and free of equipment.

All Exhibitors are eligible to participate in the Herdsmanship Award. The herdsmanship contest has three areas: Stalling Area. Practicum and Ouiz

OVERALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS

Exhibitors may compete for the Overall Performance Steer and Breed Award. This Award was created and sponsored by the Hamilton Family. Exhibitors must take the Practicum & Quiz for Herdsman to qualify for the Overall Performance Award. These awards are based on four areas of competition:

Steer or Heifer Show placing

Showmanship

Herdsman

Record Book

SHOWMANSHIP

Steer exhibitors may participate in showmanship classes following the Steer Show. Heifer exhibitors may participate in showmanship classes following the Heifer Show. The age of the exhibitor on September 1, 2022 shall determine age class.

Juniors - ages 8 to 10

- Intermediate ages 11-13
- Seniors ages 14 to 18

SHOW RING ATTIRE

Each exhibitor must wear Official 4-H or FFA Dress while in the show ring and at Awards Ceremony.

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

All complaints will be addressed in writing to the BUCSS Board. At any time the BUCSS Board reserves the right to address any issue concerning the safety and welfare of exhibitors and the general public at any time. All Placings by the judge or show official are final.

STEER SHOW & SALE

INITIAL WEIGH-IN

Initial weigh-in and tagging of steers will be on Saturday October 1, 2022 (8:00 AM – 10:00 AM) at the Bradford County Fairgrounds. No minimum weight on Steers at initial weigh-in.

FINAL WEIGH-IN

Final weigh-in of steers will be on Monday, March 6, 2023 (8:00 AM – 10:00 AM) at the Bradford County Fairgrounds. Time subject to change due to sonogrammer schedule.

WEIGHT AND GRADE

Steers must gain 1.75 pounds per day from Initial Weigh-in to Final Weigh-in.

Steers must have a minimum weight of 1,000 pounds at the final weigh-in AND

Steers must Grade USDA Select, Choice or Prime to show and sell. Grade will be based off intermuscular fat which will be determined by Ultrasound.

Steers not gaining 1.75 pounds per day, weighing a minimum of 1,000 pounds and/or grading lower than USDA Select (2.3) will be disqualified. Maximum sale weight will be 1,350 pounds.

Steers must have enough flesh to be appealing to the eye. Any animals in question will be re-evaluated by a committee for final approval.

WEIGHT GAIN CONTEST

All steers will be entered in the weight gain contest. Weight gain will be determined by the difference between the initial weigh-in and final weights.

CLASSES.

Steer classes will be determined by weight.

SALE & COMMISSION

All steers shall be consigned to the Sale. Payments made on animals sold at the fair must be made directly to the BUCSS. A 5% sales commission will be deducted from gross sale receipts for each steer or heifer sold. Add-ons will be accepted for all sale animals at the time of the sale. Any across the board add-ons will be announced at the sale. **No commission will be deducted from add-ons.**

MARKETING AND BUYER "THANK YOU" I FTTERS.

Marketing is the most important responsibility an exhibitor must do to finish a successful show steer project. All steer exhibitors will be responsible for marketing their own steer. The BUCSS strongly recommends that each exhibitor personally visit potential buyers prior the Show and Sale and secure a buyer commitment for their steer.



HEIFER SHOW

INITIAL CHECK-IN & TAGGING (NEW)

Initial check-in and tagging of heifers will be on Saturday October 1, 2022 (8:00 AM – 10:00 AM) at the Bradford County Fairgrounds. Heifers who have permanent ID tags or brands (fire or freeze) Do not have to be present at initial check in. IF you do not bring your heifer to the initial check-in you must bring a picture of the heifer with the tag visible in the ear or brand and the number or brand written on entry form. These numbers will be checked at final check-in.

FINAL CHECK-IN

Final check-in and weighing of heifers will be on Monday, March 6, 2023 (8:00 AM – 10:00 AM) at the Bradford County Fairgrounds. Time subject to change due to sonogrammer schedule.

BODY CONDITION SCORE

All heifers should have a Body Condition Score (BCS) of at least a 6. Cows with calves should have a BCS of at least 5.

AGE

Animals must not be more than 30 months old.

SALE COMMITMENT

If an exhibitor wishes to consign their heifer to the Sale, they must do so upon final check-in.

5% will be deducted from total sale of the animal to cover show expenses. Payments made on animals sold at the fair must be made directly to the BUCSS. Breed animals are to sell according to how they place in their class the night of the show.

COMMERCIAL HEIFER CLASSES

Commercial heifer classes will be determined by weight.

REGISTERED HEIFER CLASSES

- Animals must be registered in the exhibitor's name to show by October 1, 2022, <u>a copy of the registration</u> <u>papers must be turned in with the entry form. NO EXCEPTIONS</u>
- There must be 10 heifers representing a breed in order for there to be a class and champion and reserve to be selected.
- Cow/Calf pair can be shown up to 30 months of age of cow. If the calf is born before
 October Sign-Ups, and the calf is signed up as individual to be shown in its own class,
 then the calf can be shown in both cow/calf and as individual calf.

AMERICAN INFLUENCE CLASSES (NEW)

- Animals will be shown by weight unless ALL AIB are brahmans. If all are brahmans they will be shown by age.
- No minimum number of animals required to make a class.
- Animals must be classified as brahman influence on appearance of ears, navel & skin by three board members.
- Top 3 animals selected.

All Grand & Reserve animals will compete for a Supreme Champion Heifer

Failure to comply with all of the following rules and regulations may result in expulsion from the 2023 BUSA Show and Sale and/or result in refusal from showing in future shows. A grievance committee appointed by the President will rule on violations that are submitted in writing within 48 hours of an incident and determine penalties for the exhibitor(s). Any person paying for a membership and/or exhibitor's fee at the October 2022 meeting will agree this event establishes acceptance of these rules and regulations as voted and accepted by two-thirds vote of the board and current members present during the September 2022 meeting.

Exhibitors that fail to meet the requirements set forth in this document regardless if the fault is with the exhibitor themselves, parents, guardians, school, church, or clubs <u>MUST</u> deliver in writing the issue that caused the requirement not to be met and their argument on why they should not be removed from the show and/or sale within 48 hours of the incident to Paul Huntley, Brad Thomas, Nichole Stafford or Jennifer Reddish in person. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to arrange to meet with one of the above-mentioned officers and deliver their letter.

A PHONE CALL WILL NOT BE COUNTED AS PART OF THE 48-HOUR REQUIRMENT: THE LETTER ITSELF HAS TO

BE DELIVERED WITHIN THE SET TIMELINE. The letter will be forwarded to the grievance committee, the grievance committee will meet at their earliest convenience to determine the outcome of the event then notify the exhibitor, officers, and board of directors of their decision. ALL GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE DECISIONS ARE FINAL.

EXHIBITOR REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Anyone wishing to enter the 2023 BUSA show, and sale must, along with their parents or legal guardians, join the BUSA no later than the October 2022 meeting. Membership dues are non-refundable and are \$30.00 per family. The October 2022 BUSA members must also pay a registration fee of \$20.00 per exhibit. (This fee is refundable before the December tag-in if you choose not to show your animal).
- 2. Each BUSA exhibitor will be issued 10, \$2.00 FREEZER HOG TICKETS at the December 2022 meeting which will be paid in full at the October meeting. The exhibitor has a choice to sale the 10 tickets to help offset expenses of their project or keep them for themselves. All ticket stubs will be required to be turned in at the February meeting or at the weigh-in to be qualified for the freezer hog drawing at the 2023 sale. If you fail to turn in your ticket stubs by the required time, you will not be eligible to compete in the drawing for the awarded freezer hog at the 2023 BUSA sale.
- 3. The BUSA member MUST <u>attend all three mandatory meetings</u>. Each exhibitor must have someone to sign in with them at the meetings if you are under the age of 16. Each BUSA exhibitor is required to sign in at the end of each meeting. If a student has a school related or 4-H function, students must present a letter to a board member or email the letter to the BUSA email 72 hours in advance and a board member will respond within 48 hours. A parent or guardian must still attend the meeting. Meetings will be held on the second Monday of October, November, January, and February. The December meeting is Saturday, December 3rd, 2022, which is tag-in. Tag-in will begin at 7:00 AM till 9:00 AM All other meetings will begin at 7:00 PM The September meetings will be alternated each fiscal year between Bradford and Union County. Any member not compliant with this requirement will lose their right to participate in the 2023 BUSA show and sale.
- 4. BUSA members wishing to show a hog must attend school and/or be homestead in either Bradford or Union County. The BUSA member must also be an active member of 4H or FFA in Bradford or Union County. Members can only sale one market animal, members cannot sale in any other county shows.
- 5. Each BUSA exhibitor must assume all liability in case of injury or damage to, or caused by the exhibitor's animal, relieving the Fair Association, the BUSA, FFA and the 4H clubs from ALL liability.

SWINE ASSOCIATION REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. All swine must comply with health requirements of the Division of Animals and Industry, Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Service. All swine must have an 840 tag when purchased from breeder.
- 2. All Swine projects must have been owned and under the control of the BUSA exhibitor.
- 3. Only the exhibitor must care for their BUSA swine project. This means relatives and friends cannot raise your swine project for you. Housing your swine exhibit at the Bradford and Union Ag. Facilities will be acceptable.
- 4. All entries and awards in the Market Swine Show shall be subject to the Bradford County Fair Rules and Regulations published in the 2023 Fair Premium Book. These rules can be obtained at the Bradford County Fairgrounds office.

EXHIBIT INSPECTION:

An inspection team appointed by the President will be formed, if needed, to inspect swine projects.

TAG-IN

A Tag-in meeting for any BUSA active member that wishes to exhibit in the 2023 Bradford-Union Swine Show and Sale, will be held on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>December 3rd</u>, <u>2022</u>, at the Bradford Fairgrounds parking lot (on the Southside side of the midway). **This event will take place between the hours of 7:00 AM and 9:00 AM The gate will be locked at 9:00 AM** The exhibitor MUST be present along with the pig they intend to exhibit. The exhibitor is responsible to catch and hold their exhibit while it is tagged or provide someone to perform this responsibility on the exhibitor's behalf. An 840 tag is **required** from your breeder to be in your pigs' ear. We will document your swine 840 tag number along with your ear tag number for our records. Any exhibitor that fails to fulfill this requirement will not have their swine tagged, thus not qualifying for the 2023 show and sale. **Any exhibitor that has a school related or 4-H function, must turn in a letter to a board member or email the letter to the BUSA email 72 hours in advance and a board member will respond within 48 hours. (You must appoint someone to tag your pig in).**

WEIGH-IN

The final weigh-in will be Sunday, March 5th, 2023, from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM at the Bradford County Fairgrounds livestock area. **Minimum weight at the weigh-in will be 240 pounds, maximum weight not to exceed 290 pounds.** No swine exhibit will be permitted on the scale for final weigh-in unless it is clean and free of all debris to include grease, sand, mud and/or any other materials not typically found in a stock trailer used to haul market quality livestock. Sale weights will be capped at 275 pounds. At final weigh-in parent or exhibitor must be there to unload the hog off the trailer. The on-site BUSA officer or board member will determine if each exhibitor has met compliance. If swine does not meet the weight requirements, it will be up to the exhibitor to take their pig back home that night if it was cut from the show and sale. **EXHIBTORS MUST WEAR CLOSED TOE SHOES. (NO SANDALS). IF RULE IS NOT FOLLOWED, PIG WILL NOT BE WEIGHED IN**.

GRADING

Graders selected by the BUSA Committee will grade all swine. Only swine conforming to establish show standards for quality and grading, #1 swine on the hoof will be accepted, but still not to exceed the number of pens provided by the fair association. (Not to exceed 95 pigs). If we exceed more than 95 swine, we will use a sonogram for backfat at weigh in.

SHOW:

Only swine that were tagged on Saturday, December 3rd, 2022, by the BUSA and meet weight and grading requirements will be shown at the 2023 BUSA Swine Show. **NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE!**

- Immediately after weigh-in and grading is completed, a short meeting will be held in the bleacher area for last
 minute instructions and barn rules. All exhibitors are expected to be present until this meeting is over. Roll may
 be called.
- Show will be held Tuesday, March 7th, 2023, at 6:30 PM All exhibitors must be in the designated area and ready to show his/her pig when their class is called. If you do not show your animal, it will not be auctioned in the regular sale, it will be placed on the resale list and sold at resale price, plus any individual add-ons. Failure of not showing the animal will result in not being eligible to exhibit in the 2024 show. The only exceptions for not showing are a death in the immediate family or a medical emergency. A chart detailing weight and class will be posted in the swine barn.
- **JUDGES** decision is final. If an exhibitor or parent has any issue with the judge you must see a board member first to discuss any issue. If the exhibitor or parent approaches the judge, there will be disciplinary action.
- All exhibitors will follow State 4H/FFA dress code.
- Appointed members only will be allowed in the barn area and show ring.

FEEDING:

Exhibitor can have someone else clean pen and feed during show week, however if assigned person does not follow thru and feed. The exhibitor will be the one to get penalized.

SHOWMANSHIP:

The showmanship contest will be determined at a later date.

Age as of September 1, 2022

Trophies or cash awards will be awarded in the following divisions

Junior (Ages 8 to 10yrs): 1st, 2nd and 3rd place Intermediate (Ages 11 to 13yrs): 1st, 2nd and 3rd place Seniors (Ages 14 and up): 1st, 2nd and 3rd place

HOMEGROWN:

Homegrown classes will be held as the last class of the show if the grand or reserve champions are not homegrown. Hogs must have been born and raised in Bradford or Union County. A Grand and Reserve Champion will be selected. A certificate of birth signed by the breeder must be turned in at the tag-in meeting on Saturday, December 3rd, 2022, to qualify for this class. **NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE.**

SALE:

Sale will be held on Friday, March 10, 2023, time to be determined. The awards program will be on Saturday, March 11th, time to be determined.

All animals must be slaughtered following the sale to fulfill state laws.

A 5% sales commission will be deducted from the sale price. Five percent will be used to defray the cost of the Swine Show and Sale. Final weigh-in will determine sale weight; maximum sale weight is set at 275 pounds. Scale weight will be final unless the 275 capped weight rule has been placed on the exhibitors' pig.

Each exhibitor will be deducted \$15 from their check for buyer photos. BUSA will furnish one 8x10 that will be picked up with their checks. A weblink will be provided so exhibitors can order photos directly for their buyers.

Exhibitors must be at the designated area in the stands and prepared to enter the sale ring promptly in turn. Failure to comply will result in your hog being sold at the sales auctioned re-sale price. The only exception is a death in the immediate family or medical emergency.

- Entries and exhibits must be acceptable to the 4-H Youth Division Chairperson, the 4-H Agent and the Fair Association.
- 2. Registration deadline: February 23, 2023. Item check-in February 27, 2023 in building #2 at the Fairgrounds 8:00 AM 4:30 PM. Area 12 & 13 (food items) checked in on Tuesday March 7, 2023 8:00 AM 11:00 AM at the Bradford Extension Office.
- 3. Exhibitors must be a bona fide 4-H club member in Bradford or Union County.
- 4. Entries must be the work of the individual and completed within the last twelve (12) months. Entries should be the result of the 4-H project work. School projects, essays, posters and science projects are not acceptable unless they are <u>directly related to a 4-H project</u> that the 4-H individual is enrolled in during the current year.
- 5. All entries must remain until Saturday evening March 11, 2023, 8:00 PM. There will be no Sunday pickups. Premium and ribbons will be forfeited if exhibits are removed before that time. The 4-H Agent will be the only person authorized to allow removal of entries from the booth and pay premiums.
- 6. Ribbons and premiums will be awarded, and decisions of the judges are final.
- 7. All baked goods <u>must be submitted on a heavy piece of cardboard covered with aluminum foil</u>, not to exceed 2 inches beyond the baked product. Recipe must accompany each baked good. <u>Recipe must be on index card no larger than 5x7</u>.
- 8. The Fair Association, Management and 4-H Staff will not be responsible in case of damage or loss of exhibit.
- 9. Youth, 5-7 years of age will not be judged in competition. Therefore, they will be awarded participation ribbons and premium monies.
- 10. A maximum of three (3) entries will be allowed in each exhibit area.

Area 1 - Photography

Up to an 8 x 10 in size and must be framed in a plain black, brown or white frame. Photos will not be judged based on the frame. (Framing is for preserving the photo from damage).

Area 2 - Educational Material (posters, infographics, pamphlets)

Have a theme educational objective (Animal Industry, Food Safety, forestry, insects, general outdoors) and should include the 4H Clover.

Area 3 - Woodworking

Any item carved or created from wood.

Area 4 - Clothing & Textiles

Any clothing that was made and can be worn. (shirts, hats, bags or any other clothing item).

Area 5 - Fiber Arts

Knitting, crocheting, cross-stitch, blankets made by the 4H member.

Area 6 - Scrapbooking

Complete themed scrapbook or collage (single page).

Area 7 - Jewelry

Any item that is created with wire, leather, string or beads.

Area 8 - Creative Arts

Any item made from clay, wax, natural materials which may include: aluminum or other metals. Popsicle stick art, paper mache, decorated cards/stationary are also included in this area. The item must be created and decorated by the 4H member.

Area 9 - Decorated Items

These are pre purchased items that are decorated by the 4H member.

Area 10 - Paintings & Drawings

Any oil or watercolor paintings or drawings created by the 4H member. Drawings must be framed or matted on cardboard or any other hard surface so they can be displayed.

Area 11 - Poetry and Stories

Must be framed or in a binder.

Area 12 - Food & Nutrition**

Any food item that is prepared by the 4H member. Unprepared food must include recipe (such as cookies in a jar). All canned goods must be in standard canning jars with rust free lids/rings.

Area 13 - Cake Decorating**

Any cake or cupcakes baked and decorated by the 4H member.

**Area 12 & 13 items will be checked in on Tuesday, March 7, 2023 from 8:00 AM - 11:00 AM at the BC Extension Office and will have a Best In Exhibit Area for each age division.


